

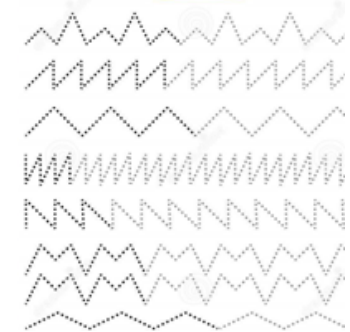
Reception Mark Making

Sticky knowledge

Key words: mark making, lines, dots, dashes, wavy, dark, light, heavy, soft, vertical, horizontal, diagonal

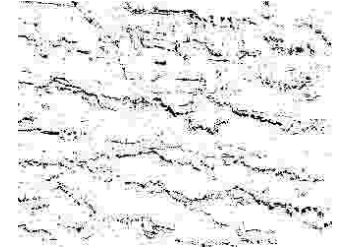
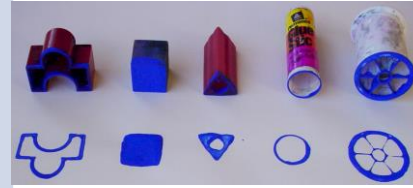

Key words: print, rub, press, pattern, repeat, respond, shape, colour, effect, 2D

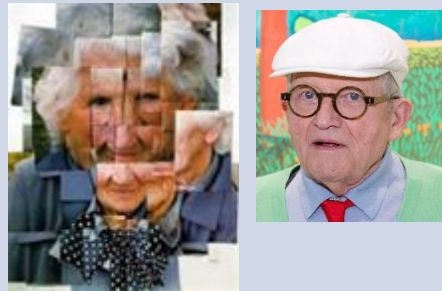

Key words: tear, layer, crumple, fold, crease, cut, fold, texture, sticky, natural materials, size

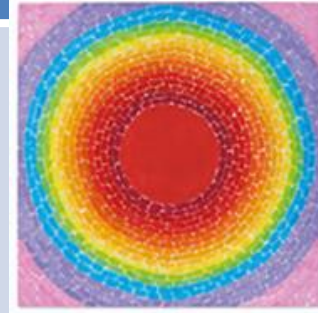
